

For homeschool siblings Manny and Cassidy Troyer of Towanda, joining an anatomy lab with animal dissections felt like an easy choice. They take Kids@Heartland classes during the school year and summer, and they jumped at the chance to learn with other homeschool students.

The brothers joined about 20 other students to try out new STEM anatomy labs that Kids@Heartland will offer this summer for open enrollment in grades 6–12. The program includes three levels —basic, intermediate, and advanced. Each class gives students hands-on time in a Heartland Community College science lab where they will use professional equipment, handle real specimens, take part in dissections, and explore biological questions. Manny, 14, and Cassidy, 13, have taken many Kids@Heartland classes. Their courses include *Rock Climbing Basics* (pages 10, 22, and 31), *Learn to Build Your Own PC* (pages 26 and 33), and *So You Want To Be an EMT* (pages 28 and 33).

Their interests reach beyond the classroom.

Cassidy enjoys foraging, working on motors, and studying English arts. He hopes to become a pilot,

either in the Air Force or as a commercial pilot. He especially liked Kids@Heartland's EMT class and enjoyed practicing CPR.

Manny loved the rock-climbing class so much that he joined a competitive climbing team. He enjoys the challenge of tough workouts. On the family's grain and sheep farm, he builds strength and confidence by climbing grain bins and other structures. He is eyeing a career as a firefighter or working with a ski patrol.

The Troyer family's connection to Heartland does not stop there. Their sister, Béla, 16, began with Kids@Heartland classes and currently takes College NOW courses. She moved from youth programs into college-level classes and continues to learn and grow.

Kids@Heartland offers classes for students in grades K–12. Students can start early and keep advancing at the College. Check inside to explore the full list of classes and the week-by-week summer schedule.
