BUSN 210 Legal Environment of Business Screening Tool for Prior Learning Credit

<u>Course Description:</u> This course provides students with fundamental knowledge concerning a series of critical legal and regulatory issues that affect business. The following areas of law will be the major focus of the course: governmental regulation of business, securities law, contract law, common law, international law, consumer protection law, employment law, and environmental law. Within the framework of professionalism, ethical decision-making, technology, and responsibility; students will discuss the global, economic, social and political environments impacting business.

<u>Purpose of this document:</u> BUSN 210 Legal Environment of Business has six learning outcomes. Evidence of achieving these learning outcomes is required for prior learning credit to be considered for this course. For each learning outcome (listed below), we have provided an example of qualifying experience. This experience, or comparable experience, should be used as a guide when deciding whether to continue with the next step in this application process for prior learning credit. You may also request to meet with a faculty member in this area for more information.

**Demonstrated work experience is most often commensurate with 1500 work hours or 1-year work experience.

- Examine the sources of law in the United States.
 - Demonstrated work experience in applying or researching judicial decisions or case law.
- Compare and contrast ethical considerations with legal requirements.
 - Demonstrated work experience applying formalism and consequentialism ethical standards into legal contracts or outcomes.
- Discuss key issues in Tort Law.
 - Demonstrated work experience in handling, assisting, or litigating legal cases involving trespassing, invasion of privacy, assault/battery, defamation, negligence or other tort law.
- Apply the principles of contract law.
 - o Demonstrated work experience in contract writing or contract enforcement.
- Compare legal issues relating to Consumer Protection.

- Demonstrated work experience working with legal issues concerning consumer protectionism such as privacy protections, equal credit opportunity, fair credit reporting, bankruptcy.
- Discuss compliance requirements in Employment Law.
 - Demonstrated work experience in applying or enforcing employment laws such as FMLA, OSHA, worker's compensation.
